30 hours free childcare

You may be able to get 30 hours free childcare if you live in England and your child is 3 to 4 years old

The childcare:

- must be with an approved childcare provider
- stops when your child starts in reception class (or reaches compulsory school age, if later)

Eligibility

To be eligible for 30 hours free childcare, you must have a National Insurance number and at least one of the following:

- British or Irish citizenship
- Settled or pre-settled status, or you have applied and you're waiting for a decision
- Permission to access public funds - your UK residence card will tell you if you cannot do this

If you have a partner, they must have a National Insurance number too.

You can usually get 30 hours free childcare if you (and your partner, if you have one) are:

- In work, on sick leave or annual leave, on shared parental, maternity, paternity or adoption leave
- Earning at least the National Minimum Wage or Living Wage for 16 hours a week on average.

You may also be eligible if your partner is working and you get Incapacity Benefit, Severe Disablement Allowance, Carer's Allowance or Contribution-based Employment and Support Allowance.

You can apply if you're starting or re-starting work within the next 31 days.
