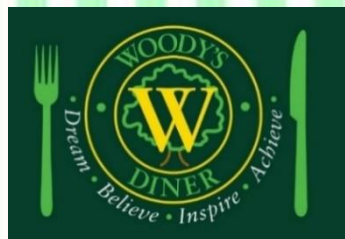

# **Height and weight checks for children in Reception and Year 6**

Every year in England, school children in reception and year 6 have their height and weight checked at school as part of the National Child Measurement Programme (NCMP). Height and weight measurements are used to calculate weight status. We collect this information to build a picture of how children are growing, to help plan better health and leisure services for families.

In most areas, parents receive their child's measurement data, because this can be useful information about their child's growth and provides an opportunity to offer support to parents where required.

**If you have a child in Reception and or Year 6, your child's class will take part in this year's programme. Parents can opt their child out of this. If you wish to opt out, please notify the main office.**

The programme will be delivered in a safe way, in line with the school and local authority's safety control measures and national guidance for schools and healthcare.

The checks are carried out by registered school nurses or trained health and care providers. Children are measured fully clothed, except for their coats and shoes, in a private space away from other pupils.

**The checks are being carried out in school on March 24<sup>th</sup>. The full letter has been emailed to all parents with a child in Reception and Year 6.**

# Bulls in the City Fundraising Day

## Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March 2025



As I have previously shared, our school has been selected to have an entry in the 2025 Bulls in the City trail, fundraising for Birmingham Hospice.

We have set up a JustGiving page, which you can see here:

we have set a target to raise £1000 for the Birmingham Hospice and we are currently at about half way. This is a fantastic achievement!

Here's how our fundraising will impact the patients of the hospice and their loved ones:

- £21 can pay for a teddy bear with a recording of a loved one's voice saying something special, for a bereaved child.
- £41 will pay for an hour of our Living Well Centre Services, supporting people to live well, managing their symptoms, and taking part in therapeutic activities.
- £56 covers the cost of a bereavement support session to help a family member coping with the loss of a loved one.
- £89 can pay for a community nurse to visit someone at home, as they manage their symptoms and coordinate their overall care.
- £95 can pay for a specialist bereavement support session to help a child coping with the loss of a loved one.
- £166 covers the cost of an occupational therapist home-visit to help individuals to be as mobile and independent as possible so they can keep doing everyday tasks.

As you can see, even the smallest donations can create a difference for the patients of Birmingham Hospice. I would be grateful for your support in sharing the JustGiving page with your friends and family as we seek to meet our target. If you feel able to contribute, then even the smallest amount will be greatly appreciated.

On **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> March** we will be having a **non-uniform day** for the children and adults in school, to help in raising further money towards our target for Birmingham Hospice. On this day, children and adults can attend in their own clothes and either **make a donation online or bring in £1**. We are also asking that children bring a packaged cake item or items to donate to a cake sale which we hold after school. This will take place on the playground at the end of the day, and your support in buying a cake or two would be greatly appreciated! During the day, we will be having a special assembly for our KS2 children, and all children will be creating their own design for our bull.

Once we have completed designing and painting it, our bull will be part of the trail, which will mean that our children will be able to find the Woodhouse Bull when taking part in the trail in Birmingham this summer! We are so proud to be able to support this wonderful charity and excited about putting Woodhouse on the map in the city of Birmingham.

As many people have now turned to digital payments, we have decided to collect for this charity via Just Giving. This allows you to make any donation you wish and to remain anonymous. It also allows the charity to receive gift aid from your donations too. Most importantly it means you don't have to search for coins on the morning. We hope that in these financially difficult times you can donate if possible. However, if this is not possible at the moment, then please don't worry, this doesn't affect your child wearing non-uniform. Another reason for being online is that no one else knows who has contributed or not. Nobody at school will be ticking names off. If for any reason digital payments are not your thing, then you can still make a contribution at the school office on the day or at the cake sale at the end of the day.

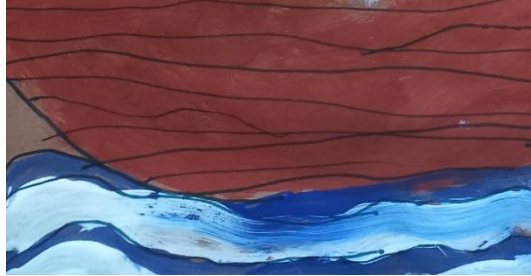

For an informal chat about your circumstances, please contact a member of staff at reception, or in the office, or one of our Support Officers.

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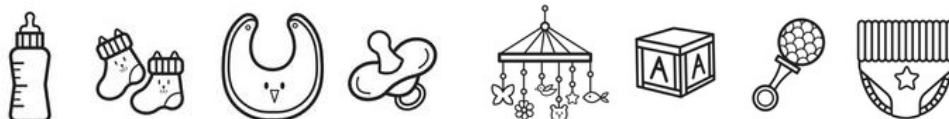
## BABY BANK

# What Parents & Educators Need to Know about WHATSAPP

## WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

With more than two billion active users, WhatsApp is the world's most popular messaging service. Its end-to-end encryption only allows messages to be viewed by the sender and any recipients: not even WhatsApp itself can read them. The UK's Online Safety Bill proposes to end such encryption on private messaging, but for the time being, this controversial feature remains.

## EVOLVING SCAMS

WhatsApp's popularity makes it a lucrative hunting ground for scammers. Recent examples include posing as the target's child, requesting a money transfer because of a spurious 'emergency' – plus a scam where fraudsters trigger a verification message by attempting to log in to your account, then (posing as WhatsApp) call or text to ask you to repeat the code back to them, giving them access.

## CONTACT FROM STRANGERS

To start a chat, someone only needs the mobile number of the WhatsApp user they want to message. Therefore, if a child has ever given their number out to someone they don't know, that person could then contact them via WhatsApp. It's also possible that the child might be added to a group chat or community (by one of their friends, for example) containing other people they don't know.

## FAKE NEWS

WhatsApp's connectivity and ease of use allow news to be shared rapidly – whether it's true or not. To combat the spread of misinformation, messages forwarded more than five times on the app now display a "forwarded many times" label and a double arrow icon. This makes users aware that the message they've just received is far from an original – and might not be entirely factual, either.

## CHAT LOCK AND SECRET CODES

In 2023, WhatsApp introduced a feature that lets users keep their chats in a separate 'locked chats' folder, saved behind their phone's passcode, fingerprint or face ID. There is an additional feature – 'Secret Code' – where users set a unique password for locked chats. Unfortunately, this creates the potential for young people to hide conversations and content they suspect their parents wouldn't approve of.

## VIEW ONCE CONTENT

The ability to send images or messages that can only be viewed once has led to some WhatsApp users sharing inappropriate material or abusive texts, knowing that the recipient can't reopen them later to use as evidence of misconduct. People used to be able to screenshot this disappearing content – but a recently added WhatsApp feature now blocks this, citing protection of privacy.

## VISIBLE LOCATION

WhatsApp's Live Location feature lets users share their current whereabouts, which can be helpful for friends meeting up or parents checking that their child is safe while out, for example. However, anyone in a user's contacts list or in a mutual group chat can also track their location – potentially letting strangers identify a child's home address or journeys that they make regularly.

## Advice for Parents & Educators

### EMPHASISE CAUTION

Encourage children to treat unexpected messages with caution; get them to consider whether it sounds like something a friend or relative would really send them. Make sure they know never to share personal details over WhatsApp, and to be wary of clicking on any links in messages. Setting up two-step verification adds a further layer of protection to their WhatsApp account.

### ADJUST THE SETTINGS

It's wise to change a child's WhatsApp settings to specify which of their contacts can add them to group chats without needing approval. You can give permission to My Contacts or My Contacts Except... Additionally, if a child needs to use Live Location, emphasise that they should enable this function for only as long as they need – and then turn it off.

### CHAT ABOUT PRIVACY

Check in with the child about how they're using WhatsApp, making sure they know you only have their safety at heart. If you spot a Locked Chats folder, you might want to talk about the sort of content they've stored in there, who they're talking to, and why they want to keep these chats hidden. Also, if children send any View Once content, it could be helpful to ask them why.

### DISCUSS GROUP CHATS

Make children aware that there could be members of a group that they don't know well and that words can be misinterpreted. Encourage them to leave a good impression, to avoid joining in if conversations turn towards bullying, and to respond to such situations in an appropriate way. Make sure they know that it's OK to leave a group chat if it makes them uncomfortable – or for any reason, in fact.

### THINK BEFORE SHARING

Help children understand why it's important to stop and think before posting or forwarding something on WhatsApp. It's easy – and all too common – for content that a user posts to be shared more widely, even publicly on social media. Encourage children to consider how an impulsive message or forwarding might damage their reputation or upset a friend who sent something to them in confidence.

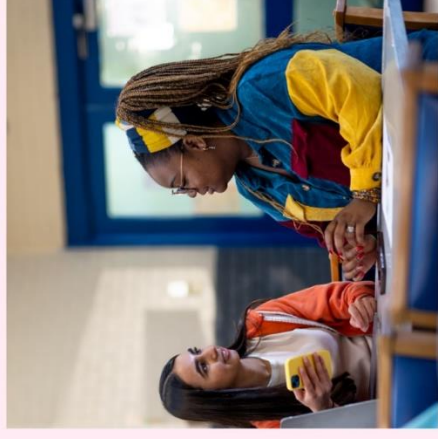


